American Bully Registry

Conformation Information & Points (All Breeds)

All dogs competing in a sanctioned American Bully Registry show must meet the standard criteria and requirements. Points awarded will be documented and stored by American Bully Registry representative, all titled classes and dogs will be verified and confirmed by American Bully Registry before points or titles are awarded for said class. All dogs looking to compete in confirmation shows will be wicketed and placed in the correct class and standard. All dogs must be registered at the time of show in order to be awarded points; those not registered will have to complete the temp registration form provided by representatives the day of the show. Prior to receiving any points the temp registration will have to have been approved and completed by the registry before points are recorded in the books.

Breed by Age:

Pre-Novice 3-6 Months

Puppy 6-12 Months

Junior 1-2 Years

Adult 2-3 Years

Senior 3 & Up

American Bully Registry

Points Awarded and Requirements

1st in Class 10 points

Best Male/Female 20 Points

Best Overall 20 Points

Best in Breed (Only Earned are for Top 10) 1 Point

1st place winners from each class will compete for best Female/Male. Dogs can't move up in show he/she originally started in, dogs can only compete in one in class per show. Must be 3 dogs total for competition. No points will be awarded if competition is unavailable, points awarded if 1st place moves up and wins best variety in his /her age Or class.

Championship Title requirements:

The following requirements must be obtained before the Championship title is awarded.

A total of 250 Points and 1 Major are required to obtain the title of American Bully Registry Champion. The Major required can be earned at 1 of 6 possible shows that are selected by the registry. The shows will be spread out across the U.S. in effort to help the breeder and Fancier travel in order to have the best competition. (Best Male/Female of variety, 3 dogs or more for Points to be awarded). Major will be awarded to the winner regardless of point status prior to that show. All Dogs must be confirmed by American Bully Registry.

Champion Classes:

All varieties will compete in the Champion Class. Each dog will be judged based off their breed standard. All dogs will have been confirmed by the American Bully Registry staff. 3 dogs or more in the ring in order to earn credit needed to be awarded the Grand Champion Title. Reserve Male/Female will be awarded points in the event the winner is found ineligible of the win. Less than 3 Champions in the ring will be for exhibition only.

The title of Champion within the American Bully Registry is a Prestigious One and takes hard work and dedication on the behalf of the handler and dog. The purpose of the Major shows (quarterly shows) is to insure that the dogs selected are deserving of the title as well as selected from the best representations of the breed/classes.

Grand Champion Requirements:

The following requirements must be obtained before the Grand Champion title is awarded.

All dogs must be confirmed by American Bully Registry, A total of 3 Championship wins must be obtained to be awarded the title. 3 Champions or more must be in ring to be Classified Competition. All 3 Championship wins must be by different judges.

Grand Champion Classes:

All Varieties will compete in Grand Champion Class. Each dog will be judged based off their breed standard. All dogs will have been confirmed by American Bully Registry. Less than 3 Grand Champions will be for Exhibition only.

Best of Breed:

Best of breed will receive 1 point for every win that will go towards Top 10 and posted on Registry website.

Major Shows (Quarterly's)

Purpose of the Quarterly's, is to ensure the winner was selected from the best representations of the respective breeds. Champion status in the American Bully Registry is one that will be held with the upmost respect and praise due to the commitment and effort to accomplish. The title will have been well deserved and the respect and honor will be given to those who achieved the task and accomplishment. A quarterly could possibly be shows hosted by other individuals other than the registry, but the registry will select and work alongside the host in the event the said show is deemed a major. These shows will be posted as soon as selected so that the breeder/handler has time to make necessary preparations if they wish to attend.



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English Bulldog

HEIGHT:

Weight should be proportionate to height

WEIGHT:

50 lbs and under, Over 50 lbs is allowed but should be proportionate to height. Obesity is a fault.

HEAD:

Large and massive in circumference, in front of the ears, should measure the height of the dog at the shoulder,

BITE:

Jaws should be massive, broad, and square and the lower jaw projecting considerably in front of the upper jaw, all dogs must be “undershot”.

EYES:

Eyes should set far apart and not protrude, situated low down in skull.

EARS:

Should be set high in the skull, front inner edge of each ear joining the outline of the skull at the top back corner of skull, wide apart and high and set as far from the eyes as possible.

BODY:

Slight slant to rear curving to the rear of the loin “roach back”, Body should be very capacious, well rounded flank and have a broad chest

LEGS:

Heavy boned and in direct proportion to the body, short- legs in proportion to the body

FEET:

Tight feet and straight are desired

TAIL:


Tail must be either short, docked or screwed which is desired

COLOR:

All coat colors are acceptable; Black is undesired and is a fault.

TEMPERAMENT:

The disposition should be kind and friendly, courageous “not vicious or aggressive”, the dogs demeanor should be passive and dignified, which are attributes that gives them their expression and behavior.



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SHORTY BULL

HEIGHT: 15 “and under (Over 15” is a Disqualification)

WEIGHT: 40 lbs. Over 40 lbs is allowed but should be proportionate to height. Obesity is a fault.

HEAD: Round head with typical bulldog features. Eyes should set far apart and not protrude. Nose should turn up slightly and may be black or liver colored. Dudley noses are a cosmetic fault.

BITE: All dogs must be undershot.

EYES: May be of any color but brown is preferred. Eyes should have an oval shape and not protrude from the skull.

EARS: Cropped, close to the head. Dogs with uncropped ears will not be allowed in the show ring.

BODY: Body should be short from withers to tail. Chest should be broad for height and have a depth reaching the elbow. A compact look is desired, width of front and hind quarters should be proportionate, not lending to a narrow rear. The chest may be broader than the rear, but narrow hindquarters are a fault.

SHOULDERS AND RUMP: Well rounded and well muscled, lending to the appearance of strength. There may be a slight rise over the loins but not to an extreme degree.

LEGS: Heavy boned and in direct proportion to the body. Long legs in proportion to the body or fine bones are a serious fault. Cow hocks and pigeon toes are a fault.

FEET: Tight feet and straight pasterns are desired. Splayed feet and weak pasterns are a fault.

TAIL: Tail must be short, either docked or screwed. No long tails permitted in the show ring.

COLOR: All coat colors are acceptable with the exception of black and tan, any tri pattern and merle.

TEMPERAMENT: Good natured and even tempered. Extreme shyness or undue aggression is a fault.



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FRENCH BULLDOG

GENERAL APPEARANCE:

The French Bulldog has the appearance of an active, intelligent, muscular dog of heavy boned, smooth coat, compactly built, and of any structure. Expression should be alert, curious, and interested.

PROPORTION AND SYMMETRY:

All points are well distributed and bear good relation one to the other; no feature being in such prominence from either excess or lack of quality that the animal appears poorly proportioned.

INFLUENCE OF SEX:

In comparing specimens of different sex, due allowance is to be made in favor of bitches, which do not bear the characteristics of the breed to the same marked degree as do the dogs.

SIZE, PROPORTION, SUBSTANCE:

Dogs should not be overweight and the Proportion—Distance from withers to ground in good relation to distance from withers to onset of tail, so that animal appears proportional or compact or well balanced and in good proportion. Substance—Muscular, heavy boned.

HEAD:

Head large and square, Eyes dark in color, wide apart, set low down in the skull, as far from the ears as possible, round in form, of moderate size, neither sunken nor bulging. In lighter colored dogs, lighter colored eyes are acceptable. No haw and no white of the eye showing when looking forward. Ears Known as the bat ear, broad at the base, elongated, with round top, set high on the head but not too close together, and carried erect with the orifice to the front. The leather of the ear fine and soft, Other than bat ears is a disqualification. The top of the skull flat between the ears; the forehead is not flat but slightly rounded. The muzzle broad, deep and well laid back; the muscles of the cheeks well developed. The stop well defined, causing a hollow groove between the eyes with heavy wrinkles forming a soft roll over the extremely short nose; nostrils broad with a well-defined line between them. Nose black, Nose other than black is a disqualification, except in the case of the lighter colored dogs, where a lighter colored nose is acceptable but not desirable. Flews black, thick and broad, hanging over the lower jaw at the sides, meeting the under lip in front and covering the teeth, which are not seen when the mouth is closed, The under jaw is deep, square, broad, undershot and well turned up.

NECK, TOPLINE, BODY:

The neck is thick and well arched with loose skin at the throat. The back can be roach back with a slight fall close behind the shoulders but it is not desired; strong and short, broad at the shoulders and narrowing at the loins. The body is short and well rounded. The chest is broad, deep, and full; well ribbed with the belly tucked up. The tail is either straight or screwed (but not curly), short, hung low, thick root and fine tip; carried low in repose or none at All.

FOREQUARTERS:

Forelegs are short, stout, straight, and muscular and set wide apart. Dewclaws may be removed. Feet are moderate in size, compact and firmly set. Toes compact, well split up, with high knuckles and short stubby nails.

HINDQUARTERS:

Hind legs are stronger and more muscular than forelegs, so the hind legs should not be elevate the loins above the shoulders. Hocks well let down. Feet are moderate in size, compact and firmly set, Toes compact.

COAT:

Coat is moderately fine, brilliant, short and smooth. Skin is soft and loose, especially at the head and shoulders, forming wrinkles.

COLOR:

All colors are acceptable.

GAIT:

Correct gait is double tracking with reach and drive; the action is unrestrained, free and vigorous.

TEMPERAMENT:

Well behaved, adaptable, and comfortable companions with an affectionate nature and even disposition; generally active, alert, and playful, but not unduly boisterous.

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American Bully

The American Bully is a strong and muscular dog with a blocky head and a compact frame. Regardless of its class, its overall structure and build should carry substance and mass effortlessly. The American Bully is a companion/friend and loves nothing more than to please its owner(s) and people in general. Though its canine ancestry have struck fear in to many, the American Bully is far from and non-aggressive towards other animal and humans. Breeding towards any aggression is prohibited and discouraged by the American Bully Registry.

Head:

The head of the American Bully is very unique and powerful in its physical appearance. Its size varies depending on class, but its structure and build should complement the overall proportion of the dog.

Jaw:

Well defined, chiseled and complimentary to the overall head structure.

Muzzle:

Length and structure are based on the dogs overall head size. Overall length should not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the dogs total head length (muzzle-occiput). The point at where the muzzle and stop meet should not exceed a 90° - 100° angle, giving the side view of the stop almost a vertical up and down appearance. The point at which the top skull and stop meet should be an abrupt drop and not taper or fade into the muzzle.

Ears:

Cropped or natural is accepted, but cropped is preferred.

Faults:

Snipy or elongated muzzle, a weak jaw that takes from the overall muscular appearance of the dog

Teeth:

Should be a scissor bite, and not over or undershot.

Neck:

Neck of the American Bully should be powerful and arched, tapering from shoulder to back of skull.

Body:

General appearance should be compact and bulky in its look. Movement should be effortless and smooth in its natural stance or gate, Muscular and powerful yet blocky and compact.

Forequarters:

Strong and muscular with wide shoulders, Elbow set should be close to body and straight. The distance from the withers to elbow is equal to the distance from elbow to the bottom of the feet. The chest should be deep and broad when in a natural stance.

Hindquarters:

Strong and muscular and let down at the hock, When view from the rear the legs should be parallel and in proportion to the front quarters.

Faults:

Hocks turning in or out, sickle or cow hocked, Straight stifles and bowed legs.

Back:

Short in length and should not exceed the overall height of the dog from ground to withers. The top line should be smooth and flat with a short and wide loin.

Tail:

Set should be low in the buttocks and medium in length meeting at the hock.

Faults:

No Tail, Long, short or tails set too high!

Tails should not be kinked or knotted, though these faults are not disqualifying they are encouraged not to breed towards.

Coat :

Short in length, fine to smooth in touch and appearance

Faults:

Curly, wavy coat and long hair

Size:

Overall size of the dog and general rule is height-length squared.

Example: If the height of the dog from ground to withers is 16 inches then the length of the dogs back from withers to croup should not exceed that length. The bully breed is a compact yet functional companion.

Overall height is by classes and noted below.

Standard:

15-19 inches

Extreme:

14-19 inches

Standards are that of the Standard American Bully, but its size and substance are more exaggerated and pronounced than that of the pocket and Standard Bullies.

Pocket :

15 inches & below

Standards are that of the Standard American Bully, but its size is much smaller. The overall appearance should remain compact and proportioned to its size.

Temperament:

The American Bully, just as the other bully breeds, is a companion and loves nothing more than to please its owner(s) and people in general. Human and dog aggression are serious faults and disqualifications when showing, and are encouraged not to breed towards Aggression. American Bully Registry strives towards the betterment of the breed and its breeders, so aggression will not be tolerated, and owners will be asked to leave American Bully Registry events when displayed.



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Standard Exotic Bully

The Exotic Bully is an extension of the American Bully but its looks and characteristics are more exaggerated and pronounced than its American Bully counterpart. Being that the class is in its infancy, current standards will be amended and adjusted in a manner that best suits the betterment of the breed and breeder. General impression of the Exotic Bully leaves little to no room for mistaking it for any of the other Bully breeds due to its over exaggerated characteristics and extreme features. Though Bulldog looks are very influential in the breed, mixing is not condoned nor accepted by the American Bully Registry.

Head:

The head of the Exotic Bully is very unique and powerful in its physical appearance. Its size is medium in size compared to its Extreme Exotic counterpart and that of the Miniature Exotic.

Jaw:

Well defined and chiseled and complimentary to the overall head structure.

Muzzle:

Length and structure are based on the dogs overall head size but should not be confused with that of the standard American Bully. Overall length should not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the dogs total head length (muzzle-occiput). The point at where the muzzle and stop meet should not exceed a 90° angle, giving the side view of the stop almost a vertical up and down appearance. The point at which the top skull and stop meet should be an abrupt drop and not taper or fade into the muzzle.

Ears:

Cropped or natural is accepted, but cropped is preferred.

Faults:

Snipey or elongated muzzle, a weak jaw that takes from the overall muscular appearance of the dog

Teeth:

Should be a scissor bite, and not over or undershot. Being that the breed is still in its development the maximum length allowed is a ½ inch, but will be shortened when an amendment of the current standard is revised, and the breed and its consistency is suitable to do so. (Dogs with under bites, should not have teeth protruding or exposed when mouth is closed)

Neck:

Neck of the Exotic Bully should be powerful and arched, with a distinct point of contact at where the crest and withers meet.

Body:

Muscled and very distinct but separable from the Am Bully, General appearance should be compact and bulky in its look. Movement should be effortless and smooth in its natural stance or gate.

Forequarters:

Strong and muscular with wide shoulders, Being that the Exotic naturally carry's more mass, the feet should be straight, Feet that are turned in or out, is accepted but not recommended breeding towards. Bowed fronts are accepted but not recommended or desired .

Hindquarters:

Strong and muscular with slight turns being accepted due to the mass carried and developmental stages of the breed. Overall size should be in proportion of the forequarters and dogs total length. Moderate angulation is desired but fault and disqualification in the ring is to be determined by the judge.

Back:

Short in length and should not exceed the overall height of the dog from ground to withers.

Tail:

Set should be low in the buttocks and medium in length meeting at the hock. Other tail varieties accepted but not recommended such as kinked, cork or short.

Coat:

Short in length and fine to smooth in appearance, Skin is moderate too loose with wrinkle accepted due to its over exaggerated characteristics.

Size:


Overall size of the dog and general rule is height-length squared.

Example: If the height of the dog from ground to withers is 16 inches then the length of the dogs back from withers to croup should not exceed that length. The bully breed is a compact yet functional companion. **(Ref: A2 for pictures)**

Overall height should be from 13-18 inches from ground to withers. All parts of the Exotic Bully should complement the other and be in proportion to the complete frame.

Temperament:



Human and dog aggression are serious faults and disqualifications when showing and are encouraged to not breed towards. ABR strives towards the betterment of the breed and its breeders so aggression will not be tolerated and owners will be asked to leave ABR events when displayed.



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

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Extreme Exotic Bully

The Extreme Exotic Bully is an extension of the Exotic Bully but its looks and characteristics are more proportioned to its size but still exaggerated in its appearance. Being that the class is in its infancy, current standards will be amended and adjusted in a manner that best suites the betterment of the breed and breeder. General impression of the Extreme Exotic Bully leaves little to no room for mistaking it for any of the other Bully breeds as well as its Exotic Standard and Miniature siblings due to its size and its extreme and exaggerated Features. Though Bulldog looks are very influential in the breed, mixing is not condoned nor accepted by the American Bully Registry.

Head:

The head of the Extreme Exotic Bully is very unique and powerful in its physical appearance. Its size is larger compared to its Standard Exotic Bully counterpart and that of the Micro Exotic Bully.

Jaw:

Well defined and chiseled and complimentary to the overall head structure.

Muzzle:

Length and structure are based on the dogs overall head size but should not be confused with that of the standard American Bully. Overall length should not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the dogs total head length (muzzle-occiput). The point at where the muzzle and stop meet should not exceed a 90° angle, giving the side view of the stop almost a vertical up and down appearance. The point at which the top skull and stop meet should be an abrupt drop and not taper or fade into the muzzle.

Ears:

Cropped or natural is accepted, but cropped is preferred.

Faults:

Snipey or elongated muzzle, higher rear loin, loin cannot pass head of dog, a weak jaw that takes from the overall muscular appearance of the dog

Teeth:

Should be a scissor bite, and not over or undershot. Being that the breed is still in its development the maximum length allowed is a ½ inch, but will be shortened when an amendment of the current standard is revised, and the breed and its consistency is suitable to do so. (Dogs with under bites, should not have teeth protruding or exposed when mouth is closed)

Coat:

Short in length and fine to smooth in appearance, Skin is moderate too loose with wrinkle accepted due to its over exaggerated characteristics.

Neck:

Neck of the Extreme Exotic Bully should be powerful and arched, with a distinct point of contact at where the crest and withers meet. Size is much larger and preferred then that of the Standard Exotic.

Body:

Height 14"- 20"

Muscled and very distinct but separable from the Am Bully, General appearance should be compact and bulky in its look. Movement should be effortless and smooth in its natural stance or gate. The Extreme Exotic is the larger of the Exotic classes and rightfully so should carry much more mass and exaggerated features.

Forequarters:

Strong and muscular with wide shoulders, being that the Extreme Exotic naturally carry's more mass, feet should be straight, Feet that are turned in or out, is accepted but not recommended breeding towards. Bowed fronts are accepted but not recommended or desired.

Hindquarters:

Strong and muscular with slight turns being accepted due to the mass carried and developmental stages of the breed. Overall size should be in proportion of the forequarters and dogs total length. Moderate angulation is desired but fault and disqualification in the ring is to be determined by the judge.

Back :

Short in length and should not exceed the overall height of the dog from ground to withers.

Tail:

Set should be low in the buttocks and medium in length meeting at the hock. Other tail varieties accepted but not recommended such as kinked, cork or short or missing

Size:


Overall size of the dog and general rule is height-length squared. The Extreme Exotic is the largest of the Exotic classes but its presence and feature are bold and powerful.

Example: If the height of the dog from ground to withers is 17 inches then the length of the dogs back from withers to croup should not exceed that length. The bully breed is a compact yet functional companion.

Overall height should be below 19 inches from ground to withers. All parts of the Extreme Exotic Bully should complement the other and be in proportion to the complete frame.

Temperament:

The Exotic classes are companions and love nothing more than to please owners and people in general. Human and dog aggression are serious faults and disqualifications when showing and are encouraged to not breed towards. American Bully Registry strives towards the betterment of the breed and its breeders so aggression will not be tolerated and owners will be asked to leave American Bully Registry events when displayed.



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Micro Exotic Bully

The Micro Exotic Bully is an extension of the Exotic Bully but its looks and characteristics are more proportioned to its size but still exaggerated in its appearance. Being that the class is in its infancy, current standards will be amended and adjusted in a manner that best suites the betterment of the breed and breeder. General impression of the Micro Exotic Bully leaves little to no room for mistaking it for any of the other Bully breeds as well as its Exotic Standard and Extreme siblings due to its smaller the average size and exaggerated characteristics. Though Bulldog looks are very influential in the breed, mixing is not condoned nor accepted by the American Bully Registry.

Head:

The head of the Micro Exotic Bully is very unique and powerful in its physical appearance. Its size is smaller compared to its Standard Exotic Bully counterpart and that of the Extreme Exotic.

Jaw:

Well defined and chiseled and complimentary to the overall head structure.

Muzzle:

Length and structure are based on the dogs overall head size but should not be confused with that of the standard American Bully. Overall length should not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the dogs total head length (muzzle-occiput). The point at where the muzzle and stop meet should not exceed a 90° angle, giving the side view of the stop almost a vertical up and down appearance. The point at which the top skull and stop meet should be an abrupt drop and not taper or fade into the muzzle. Being that this class is much smaller than the others, muzzle length may be much shorter and preferred as long as it presents no health issues to the dog or its wellbeing.

Ears:

Cropped or natural is accepted, but cropped is preferred.

Faults:

Snipey or elongated muzzle, a weak jaw that takes from the overall muscular appearance of the dog. This is the most difficult of the classes to breed so overall height must be equal in front and rear quarters showing no high rear. (Entire dog must be short)

Teeth:

Should be a scissor bite, and not over or undershot. Being that the breed is still in its development the maximum length allowed is a ½ inch, but will be shortened when an amendment of the current standard is revised, and the breed and its consistency is suitable to do so. (Dogs with under bites, should not have teeth protruding or exposed when mouth is closed)

Coat:

Short in length and fine to smooth in appearance, Skin is moderate to loose with wrinkle accepted due to its over exaggerated characteristics.

Neck:

Neck of the Micro Exotic Bully should be powerful and arched, with a distinct point of contact at where the crest and withers meet.

Body:

Muscled and very distinct but separable from the American Bully, General appearance should be compact and bulky in its look. Movement should be effortless and smooth in its natural stance or gate.

Forequarters:

Strong and muscular with wide shoulders, Being that the Micro Exotic naturally carry's more mass, the feet should be straight. Feet that are turned in or out, is accepted but not recommended breeding towards, bowed fronts are accepted but not recommended or desired

Hindquarters:

Strong and muscular with slight turns being accepted due to the mass carried and developmental stages of the breed. Overall size should be in proportion of the forequarters and dogs total length. Moderate angulation is desired but fault and disqualification in the ring is to be determined by the judge.

Back:

Short in length and should not exceed the overall height of the dog from ground to withers.

Tail:

Set should be low in the buttocks and medium in length meeting at the hock. Other tail varieties accepted but not recommended such as kinked, cork or short.

Size:

Height: 13” -Below

Overall size of the dog and general rule is height-length squared. The Micro is the smallest of the classes but its presence and feature are bold and powerful.

Example: If the height of the dog from ground to withers is 12 inches then the length of the dogs back from withers to croup should not exceed that length. The bully breed is a compact yet functional companion.

Overall height should be below 13 inches from ground to withers. All parts of the Micro Exotic Bully should complement the other and be in proportion to the complete frame.

Temperament:

The Exotic classes are companions and love nothing more than to please owners and people in general. Human and dog aggression are serious faults and disqualifications when showing and are encouraged to not breed towards. American Bully Registry strives towards the betterment of the breed and its breeders so aggression will not be tolerated and owners will be asked to leave American Bully Registry events when displayed.

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
